Feline Infectious Disease Testing Patient Consent Form

One in seven cats presenting with oral disease will test positive for feline immunodeficiency virus (FIV) and/or feline leukemia virus (FeLV).¹ FIV and FeLV infections can be life-threatening.

FIV and FeLV infections are spread by casual contact among pets (such as mutual grooming), or by fighting and biting. Proper testing and management can give your FIV/FeLV-infected pet a longer, healthier life.

Cats with any outdoor access, including porch/deck/garage access, or cats that escape occasionally should be tested as they are the most susceptible to infection.

To provide the best possible care for your pet, our practice is offering a simple test to screen for FIV and FeLV.
