Packing specimens for shipping

IDEXX

1. Label specimens properly (figure 1).

Each specimen should be identified with the following:

- + Patient first and last name
- + Date
- + Specimen type
- + Use clear, legible writing—the clearer the handwriting, the less chance of error.

If using label:

- + Do not wrap label around tube.
- + Do not leave excess label hanging off/sticking out from tube.
- + Do not cover contents of tube with label.
- + Do not use tape to seal the tube shut.

2. Include a test requisition form.

 Fold the form in quarters as illustrated in figure 2.
 IMPORTANT: Place the form in the rear pocket of the specimen bag with the bar code facing out.

3. Box the specimens (figure 3).

- + Place specimens in the specimen bag, one patient per bag.
- Place the sealed specimen bag in an IDEXX-Direct[®] shipping box (multiple specimen bags can be included in one box).
- Include a cold pack in a separate sealed bag in the box. IMPORTANT: Keep cold pack and specimen bags separate—do not insert cold pack into specimen bag; do not insert specimens into cold pack.
- + Do not include packing materials, i.e., no peanuts, newspaper, or bubble wrap.

STEP TWO: Fold in half again vertically so bar code is visible.



STEP THREE: Place form in specimen bag pocket with **bar code** facing out.



STEP ONE: Fold in half horizontally so bar code is visible.

Shipping specimens via UPS®

1. Categorize specimens.

Determine which category applies to each specimen:

- + Exempt animal specimens:* These are specimens that are unlikely to contain pathogens. Most specimens you send to IDEXX will be categorized as exempt animal specimens. Examples: Specimens for chemistry panels or urinalysis.
- + Category B specimens:* These are specimens that are infectious substances that are not transported in a form generally capable of causing disability or lifethreatening disease. Only a few IDEXX tests require you to submit Category B specimens. Examples: Blood culture, fecal culture, or fecal PCR testing.
- Category A specimens: These are specimens that are infectious substances that are transported in a form capable of causing disability or life-threatening disease. IDEXX does not accept Category A specimens. Example: Bacillus anthracis culture.

2. Package specimens.

Place the IDEXX-Direct[®] shipping box into the UPS[®] Laboratory Pak that corresponds to the category of the specimen and seal the package:

- Exempt animal specimens: You must use the UPS[®] Laboratory Pak for Exempt Human and Animal Specimens.
- Category B specimens: You must use the UPS[®]
 Laboratory Pak for Biological Substance, Category B (UN3373).

IMPORTANT: Do not combine specimens of different categories in the same package.



3. Attach UPS shipping label to package.

4. Arrange pickup or drop-off.

Pickup

- + Place the package at your designated UPS[®] Pickup Point at your practice, which should be located near your UPS shipping placard.
- Existing IDEXX UPS customers can schedule a pickup by following the instructions on their UPS shipping placard or contacting the UPS U.S. Laboratory Support line at 1-844-4UPS-LAB (1-844-487-7522).
- + Non UPS customers can schedule a pickup by visiting ups.com or contacting UPS customer support at 1-800-PICK-UPS (1-800-742-5877).

Drop-off

- + Exempt animal specimens: Shipments are accepted at The UPS Store[®] and UPS[®] Customer Centers.
- Category B specimens: Shipments are accepted at UPS Customer Centers and UPS[®] Drop Box locations.

5. Track your package.

+ Go to ups.com and enter your tracking number.
